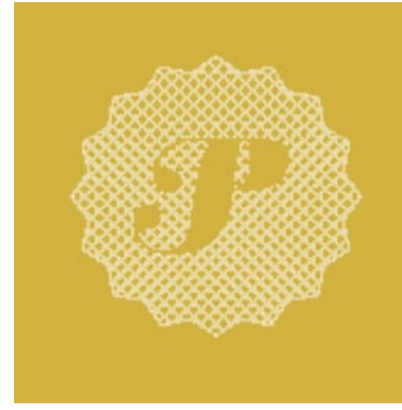

Blind Assessment: Richly bittersweet, deep-toned. Hop flowers, pink peppercorn, tangerine zest, quince, fresh-cut fir in aroma and cup. Sweet-savory structure with friendly, accessible acidity; satiny-smooth mouthfeel. The bittersweet finish centers around tangerine zest and quince.

Notes: Produced by Charles Denison of Elephant Coast Estate from the rare, tiny-beaned South African indigenous coffee species Racemosa, and processed by the washed method.
